## **Board Meetings**


The Board has two vacancies currently: the Treasurer Position and a Director at Large Position. We're very grateful for the three volunteers who expressed interest at the January 22 Meet & Greet about filling these positions. The Board will be having a special meeting on March 15 at 6:00 p.m. to consider the appointment of two new Board Members.

The Board recently voted to move quarterly meetings from the  $1^{st}$  Tuesday of the quarter to the  $3^{rd}$  Tuesday of the quarter to give more time for financial reports to come in.

The Board is also voting on the formation of a CC&R Simplification Committee this year. It is the Board's goal to synthesize the 15 CC&Rs down to one readable document. The Modification Committee has been hard at work and is finalizing a Design Guideline change that will synthesize the four Architectural Review Committee Declaration of Residential Guidelines and Contractor Standards down into one document. Between these two changes this year, we hope to make a more easily understood HOA and begin fielding suggestions for substantive changes in the rules.

#### **Tree Removal & Maintenance**

Over the next couple of weeks, the HOA is having tree cleanup and maintenance done to the following common areas on the map below. There are several trees that were dead and had to be removed, so the final stump removal is occurring now. Other trees were causing property damage to nearby homeowner fences, and another tree is becoming a hazard as it leans. Trees that are able to be replaced without creating a hazard in the future will be replaced, and for areas where trees cannot be replaced, other landscaping is planned.

## **Security Cameras and Other Modifications**

It's come to the HOA's attention that there have been security cameras put up without modification committee approval. We understand you want to protect your property, and that is great and will help increase the value of our neighborhood, but the proper process must be followed. Security cameras and lights, like any other exterior change, must go through the Modification Committee. This is to protect you and your neighbors because the Modification Committee requires proof that the cameras are only pointed to your own property and are not capturing any footage outside of your property lines.
